Worthy had been hiving, testified that the ac cused was a "bookkeeper" by occupation, and that he was of a peaceable and quiet disposition, She had beard that Sullivan bad threatened to actered" on both McNorthy and her if they did not let Rosse Kelly alone. Police Officer Warren detailed the circumstances of the arrest of Su'hvan and the finding of McWorthy in a dring condition. No pastel, be said, could be found upon either of the men. Dr. Blach, City Physican, testined as to the revelations of the autoj sy. Sullivan was present with his attorney. but removed to make any statement. Then the testimony presented, the jury charged Sullivan with the crime of mander.

The Murder of Edward McWorthy.

No new facts have been developed in the murder of Edward McWorthy, yesterday morning, by James Sullivan. Sullivan is still reticent in regard to the shooting, but explains that he is acting under the advice of his counsel. When his case was called in the Pelice Court this morning it was continued until next Tuesday, in order to await developments of the inquest.

An autopey was held last evening on Mc-Worthy's remains, and it was found that the build, after entering the left temple, passed through the brain, shatter up the skull also on the right side, about two mones above the car.
